Introduction to Today's Readings

First Reading: Job 38: 1, 8-11

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 5: 14-17

The book of Job is a long parable which grapples with the question of why bad things happen to good people. In today's passage, God responds to Job and in effect says, "I created and I sustain the whole universe, including the mighty oceans. So answers to questions like why people suffer are beyond your limited knowledge."

Some members of the Corinthian community found it hard to accept Paul's teachings. They challenged his credentials as an apostle because he was not an eyewitness to the earthly life of Jesus. In this passage, Paul defends his ministry as an apostle.
