Introduction to Today's Readings

First Reading: Exodus 15: 2-4, 12-15



Second Reading: Ephesians 4: 17, 20-24

The book of Exodus tells of the Israelites' escape from Egypt and their journey to Mount Sinai some 1200 years before Christ. The bread described in today's reading is called *manna*, a word derived from the ancient Hebrew words for "what is this?"

In our series of readings from the letter to the Ephesians, we have come to a part of the letter which gives advice for daily living. Today's reading describes the effects of baptism. In the waters of baptism, we symbolically die to one way of living and rise to a new way of life.
