**Introduction to Today's Readings**

*First Reading:* Isaiah 53:10-11

*Second Reading:* Hebrews 4:14-16

Our first Scripture reading contains the message of a prophet who spoke to the Jewish people during their exile in Babylon. In four different places, this prophet speaks about a "Servant of God" who will one day deliver God's people and make them great again. Because the Servant is frequently portrayed as suffering, Christians have applied this to Jesus. Today's reading is a small portion from the last and longest of these four passages. (On Good Friday we read the entire passage.)

The Jewish high priest was responsible for entering the holiest place in the Jerusalem temple to make sin offerings on behalf of the people. Several times, the Letter to the Hebrews emphasizes that Jesus is superior to any high priest because he has entered the heavenly temple, and thus has given us access to God's "Throne of Grace."

Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you. ~ Psalm 33
