Clergy Notes

Dear Catholic Community,

Of the three Synoptic Gospels, the Gospel of Luke uses "baptism of repentance" (baptisma metanoias). 'Repentance' is the common translation for the Greek word metanoia, which means not just sorrow for past sins but a total and radical change of outlook in our relationship with God and other people. It calls for a radical and genuine renewal and CONVERSION of heart. This metanoia or conversion in turn will bring about the forgiveness of sin -- a release, a letting go, a liberation from the chains of sin and evil. Forgiveness also involves a total reconciliation with our God and with all those whom we have hurt or with whom we have come in conflict. It is a healing, a making whole.

The Precepts of the Catholic Church are a description of the absolute minimum actions required of Catholics regarding the Church and one of the precepts directs us that "You shall confess your sins at least once a year." As we enter the second week of the Advent, there's no better time to repent and reconcile ourselves. We are invited to be released from the burden of sins and forgive (and be forgiven). We'll have Advent Penance Service / Individual Confession (Sacrament of Reconciliation) this Thursday, December 10th. Please take this opportunity, if not already, to receive the baptism of repentance.

Holy Year of Mercy: On the 8th of December, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, the Holy Door of Saint Peter's Basilica will be opened. Pope Francis stated in his letter <u>Misericordiae Vultus</u> that on that day The Holy Door will become a DOOR OF MERCY through which anyone who enters will experience the love of God who consoles, pardons and instills hope. On the following Sunday, the Third Sunday of Advent, the Holy Door of the Basilica of St, John Lateran in Rome will be opened also. In the following weeks, the Holy Doors of the other Papal Basilicas will be opened. We will see this happen at the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, DC. On the same Sunday, Pope Francis will announce that in every local church, at the cathedral of special significance, a Door of Mercy will be opened for the duration of the Holy Year which lasts until November 20, 2016. At the discretion of the local bishop, a similar door may be opened at any shrine frequented by large groups of pilgrims. In this Jubilee Year, let us allow God to surprise us. He never tires of casting open the doors of his heart.

Prayer for the Holy Year of Mercy: Lord Jesus Christ, you taught us to be merciful like the heavenly Father, and have told us that whoever sees you sees him. Show us your face and we will be saved. Your loving gaze freed Zacchaeus and Matthew from being enslaved by money; the adulteress and Magdalene from seeking happiness only in created things; made Peter weep after his betrayal; and assured Paradise to the repentant thief. Let us hear, as if address to each one of us, the words that you spoke to the Samaritan woman: "If you knew the gift of God!" You are the visible face of the invisible Father, of the God who manifests his power above all by forgiveness and mercy: let the Church be your visible face in the world, its Lord risen and glorified. You willed that your ministers would also be clothed in weakness in order that they may feel compassion for those in ignorance and error: let everyone who approaches them feel sought after, loved, and forgiven by God. Send your Spirit and consecrate every one of us with its anointing so that the Jubilee of Mercy may be a year of grace from the Lord, and your Church, with renewed enthusiasm, may bring good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives and the oppressed, and restore sight to the blind. We ask this through the intercession of Mary, Mother of Mercy, you who live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit for ever and ever. AMEN.
