Readings – Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: 1 Kings 17:17-24

The prophet Elijah lived about 800 years before Christ. After predicting a drought which did, in fact, take place, God directed him to a pagan city of Zarephath. There, despite a severe famine, a widow provided food for him for a year. Today's reading picks up from there.

I will praise you, Lord, for you have rescued me. Psalm 30

Second Reading: Galatians 1:11-19

Galatia was a Roman province in central Turkey, where Paul had preached the Gospel. Today's reading is autobiographical. Paul defends his teaching, pointing out that he did not receive the Gospel secondhand but directly from the Risen Jesus.
