**Readings for the weekend of 29-30 October -
Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time**

First Reading: Wisdom 11:22-12:2 The book of Wisdom was written by a teacher who lived in Alexandria, Egypt, a center for Greek philosophy in the ancient world. It was written about 50 years before Christ, and was the last book of the Old Testament to be written. After the first verse of today's passage, the author speaks directly to God and does so in poetic fashion.

I will praise your name for ever, my king and my God.
Psalm 145

Second Reading: 2 Thessalonians 1:11-2:2 In his first letter to the Thessalonians, Paul told them always to be prepared for the Lord's coming in glory. Some of them became preoccupied with the date when the Lord would come. The second letter to this community addresses that situation.

Solemnity of All Saints**

First Reading: Revelation 7:2-4, 9-14 The Book of Revelation is not intended to predict actual people and events in future times. The author was concerned only about people and events in that time and was given no privileged information about the future. In today's passage, the author encourages people of that time by presenting a vision of God's people enjoying heavenly life.

Second Reading: 1 John 3:1-3 In our first reading, we heard symbolic images of what heaven will be like. The author of our second reading also talks about what heaven will be like, but without attempting to give us any specific details.
