**Readings for the weekend of 5-6 November –
Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time**

First Reading: 2 Maccabees 7:1-2, 9-14

The two books of Maccabees describe a period of persecution suffered by the Jews about 150 years before Christ. At that time, they were a nation subject to Syria whose king tried to force them to abandon their religious customs. Today's passage describes the resistance of one family, whose bravery became legendary.

Lord, when your glory appears, my joy will be full.

Second Reading: 2 Thessalonians 2:16-3:5 The two letters to the Thessalonians were addressed to a Christian community founded by Paul early in his missionary travels. Thessalonica was located in the northeastern portion of modern-day Greece. Early Christians believed that Jesus would return soon; these letters address how they out to live as they await that coming.
