**Readings for the weekend of 12-13 November –
Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time**

First Reading: Malachi 3:19-20

The book of Malachi was written after the Jews returned from exile in Babylon. Faced with problems on all sides, many in the community doubted whether God would ever again act on their behalf. In today's passage, Malachi responds to these skeptics.

The Lord comes to rule the earth with justice.

Psalm 98

Second Reading: 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12

The second letter to the Thessalonians addresses concern early Christians had about the coming of Christ in glory. Some were excessively interested in the day and hour of Christ's coming. Others through that his imminent coming was an invitation to idleness.
