This Weekend’s Readings

First Reading 📖 **2 Kings 4:8-11, 14-16**

Elisha, who lived about 800 years before Christ, succeeded the great prophet Elijah, and was noted for his miraculous deeds. Today we hear of one such deed performed in gratitude for the hospitality given to him and his servant Gehazi.

Second Reading 📖 **Romans 6:3-4, 8-11**

In a previous section of his letter to the Romans, Paul taught that we sinners are reconciled to God through the death and resurrection of Jesus. Now Paul notes that we experience this dying and rising when, in the immersion form of baptism, we are symbolically “buried” in the water and emerge to new life.
