This Weekend's Readings

First Reading 📖 **Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14**

The book of Daniel was written 150 years before Christ, during a time when the Jews were experiencing fierce persecution. It is meant to encourage the people by telling heroic stories of a person named Daniel who lived many centuries earlier. Today's reading describes his vision of heaven, and is written in symbolic language – similar to the book of Revelation. The term "Son of Man" meant a human chosen by God for a special purpose. Christians have applied this vision to Jesus.

Second Reading 📖 **2 Peter 1:16-19**

The second letter of Peter was written approximately 100 years after Jesus' death and resurrection. It was written in Peter's name, a practice common at that time. Because, after all these years, Jesus had not yet returned in glory, some people lost faith that he would ever return. Today's passage describes the Transfiguration, to which

Peter was an eyewitness. The author wants to reassure the people that what they believe about Jesus is true.
