The family of MSG Otis Fleming, USAF/USA (ret.) wished to notify our congregation that Mr. Fleming passed away on 3 October 2017 at the Walter Reed National Medical Center. He was a long-time parishioner at Memorial Chapel – always present at the Sunday Mass. He is interred in the Natchez (MS) National Cemetery. Mr. Fleming, who was 85, served in the US Air Force and retired from the US Army after 27 years. He served in both the Korean and the Viet Nam wars and earned numerous awards and commendations.
