INTRODUCTION TO THIS WEEKEND'S READINGS

First Reading 📖 **Exodus 22:20-26**

The book of Exodus recounts how the Jews escaped from slavery in Egypt and made a covenant, God also included other laws. Note that many of them deal with how we treat other people.

Second Reading 📖 **1 Thessalonians 1:5-10**

Some geography will help us appreciate this reading. Macedonia was a Roman province in northern Greece in which the city of Thessalonica was located. In this, his first letter to the Thessalonians, Paul reports that, on his journey, he learned that their *exemplary* faith was already known and talked about throughout Greece.
