This Weekend's Readings

First Reading: Leviticus 13:1-2, 44-46

The third book of the Bible, Leviticus, is a collection of Jewish laws. Old Testament people believed that being clean or unclean (that is, kosher or non-kosher) was based on what was considered to be normal or abnormal, and therefore unclean. By the same standards, people with disabilities or deformities were seen as unclean. We see a particular case addressed in this reading.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 10:31-11:1

Today's passage concludes a long section of First Corinthians in which Paul has been addressing disputes between Jewish Christians and Gentile Christians about what foods are kosher. Paul now makes a general observation that while we may *in principle* be free to do this or that, we should avoid those things that disrupt harmony and peace.

FLU SEASON IS UPON US - - As you know, there is widespread flu activity in our area and across the country. This year's strain of flu is a particularly severe virus. We encourage everyone to get the flu vaccine (not too late) and to practice good hygiene measures. Hand washing, cover your cough/sneezes in your elbow, stay home if you are sick, rest and fluids, use of liquid sanitizer (provided at back of chapel) contact your doctor as needed. Many precautions have been set up in our communities to minimize the spread of flu within our work, school, faith based and social environments.
