**THIS WEEKEND'S READINGS**

**First Reading: Jeremiah 31:31-34**

The prophet Jeremiah ministered at a difficult time in Jewish history. Jerusalem, their beloved capitol, had been destroyed, and most of the people taken captive to far-off Babylon. In this gloomy setting, Jeremiah expresses the conviction of the Lord will raise up a new leader from the line of David to restore and rebuild their homeland.

**Second Reading: Hebrews 5:7-9**

The Letter to the Hebrews was written to a Christian community that had become dispirited and whose faith was faltering. Jesus is presented in Today's passage as a model of suffering and a source of strength in time of need. (This passage is also part of the second reading on Good Friday.)
