First Reading: Exodus 19:3 – 8a, 16 – 20b *Pentecost is the renewal of the covenant on Sinai*

Second Reading: Romans 8:22 – 27 – *On this "festival of firstfruits" The Spirit is sent as the firstfruits of the Resurrection*

PENTECOST MASS DURING THE DAY

First Reading Acts 2:1-22 – *As on Sinai, the Lord descends in fire and wind*

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13 – *the Spirit calls the baptized to ministry for the common good*

The Pentecost readings describe the presence of the Spirit in the lives of the people of God. The apostles had to wait until the first Pentecost to receive the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is within each of us. Moreover, together we are united in the Spirit, who moves among us, here in this building as well as around the whole world.
