Personal Ordinariate of the Chair of Saint Peter: a diocese for Roman Catholics who were nurtured in the Anglican tradition or whose faith has been renewed by the Ordinariate's liturgy and evangelizing mission. Chaplain Whitehead has been an Army chaplain since 2010, with prior service as an Air Force Reserve chaplain. He will be ordained a priest on 31

May 2018, and will continue to serve as an Army chaplain at Arlington National Cemetery. He is married to Kate, they have six children and another due in August. Chaplain Whitehead will begin pastoral duties in June.

Much like the Archdiocese for Military Services, the Ordinariate covers a broad geographical area that overlaps traditional diocesan boundaries. The Ordinariate's liturgy retains the eloquence of the Anglican tradition, while conforming to Catholic doctrinal, sacramental, and liturgical standards. Permission has been given on a case-by-case basis by the Pope for former Anglican priests who are married to be ordained Catholic priests for the Ordinariate.
