SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

First Reading: Exodus 24:3-8

Today's passage from the book of Exodus describes the covenant between God and the Israelite people. A covenant is a solemn agreement made between two parties and was usually sealed in blood. In ancient times, blood was considered the source of life. To sprinkle two people with the same blood bonded them as closely as if they were blood relatives.

Second Reading: Hebrews 9:11-15

On Yom Kippur, the high priest sacrificed a goat on the altar in the temple. Then he took some of the blood into the holiest place in the temple sanctuary where only he was allowed to go. There, he sprinkled that blood as a renewal of the covenant made at Mount Sinai, and prayed that God would forgive the sins they had committed during the previous year. This ritual is the backdrop for the reading from the letter to the Hebrews.

MEET CHAPLAIN WHITEHEAD, OUR NEW PASTOR - - Chaplain Matthew Whitehead is a priest ordained in the Personal Ordinariate of the Chair of Saint Peter: a diocese for Roman Catholics who were nurtured in the Anglican tradition or whose faith has been renewed by the Ordinariate's liturgy and evangelizing mission. Chaplain Whitehead has been an Army chaplain since 2010, with prior service as an Air Force Reserve chaplain. He was ordained on 31 May 2018, and will continue to serve as an Army chaplain at Arlington National Cemetery. He is married to Kate, they have six children and another due in August. Chaplain Whitehead begins his pastoral duties in June.



Much like the Archdiocese for Military Services, the Ordinariate covers a broad geographical area that overlaps traditional diocesan boundaries. The Ordinariate's liturgy retains the eloquence of the Anglican tradition, while conforming to Catholic doctrinal, sacramental, and liturgical standards. Permission has been given on a case-by-case basis by the Pope for former Anglican priests who are married to be ordained Catholic priests for the Ordinariate.

WEEKEND OF 9-10 JUNE - - our pastor, Fr. John Barkemeyer, will celebrate his last Masses with us before he leaves for his next duty station.
