FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FIRST READING: EZEKIEL 2:2-5

The first scripture reading describes the call of the prophet Ezekiel. He was a Jewish priest who was deported to Babylon at the time of the exile. He is called to proclaim God's word to those who are exiled with him. God warns him that this will be no easy task.

SECOND READING: 2 CORINTHIANS 12:7-10

In the passage just preceding today's reading from Paul's letter to the Corinthians, he described some of his spiritual visions and revelations. But in today's passage, he chooses not to boast of these, but rather to talk about how God has worked through him despite his weaknesses.
