### READINGS -- TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FIRST READING: GENESIS 2:18-24

The first 11 chapters of Genesis have very little historical foundation, but they teach religious truths in parable form. In Chapter One and Chapter Two, there are two quite different accounts of creation. Today we hear a part of the second account.

SECOND READING: HEBREWS 2:9-11

Today and for the next six Sundays, our second reading will come from the Letter to the Hebrews. The section from which today's passage is taken as perhaps the New Testament's most profound commentary on the implications of Jesus becoming a human being.

**PRAYERS FOR THE CHURCH** - - Pope Francis has requested that during the month of October, we dedicate the daily rosary for the unity of the Church. He is also asking for us to pray to Saint Michael the Archangel and to the Blessed Virgin Mary (*Sub Tuum Praesidium*) to protect the Church from evil.

Prayer aids for the Rosary and Saint Michael the Archangel prayer cards can be found on near the brochures in the back of the chapel, in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel, and in the Catholic Office.

The *Sub Tuum Praesidium* [We Fly to Thy Protection] is the oldest known prayer to our Holy Mother of God:

#### Sub Tuum Praesidium

*Sub tuum praesidium confugimus Sancta Dei Genitrix. Nostras deprecationes ne despicias in necessitatibus, sed a periculis cunctis libera nos semper, Virgo Gloriosa et Benedicta*

[We fly to thy protection, O Holy Mother of God. Do not despise our petitions in our necessities, but deliver us always from all dangers, O Glorious and Blessed Virgin]
